# 5. PROPOSED DEVELOPMENTAL WORK AND APPROVAL OF EXPENDITURE FROM AVAILABLE FUNDS OF THE INSTITUTE

# A.Post-facto approval for expenditure from available funds of the institute for necessary developmental work:

- B. Proposed developmental works to be executed and approval for estimated expenditure thereof -:
- I. Procurement and Installation and Maintenance of CCTV cameras:

  An amount of Rs. 5 lakh is approved for expenditure from IRG Fund for procurement of CCTV, installation and maintenance. The CCTVs will be fixed at New Academic Building and the three(03) main gates of the institution.

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#### II. Procurements of Books and furniture for Library:-

An amount of Rs. 6 Lakhs is approved from Institution Development Fund to purchase books as per the syllabus and necessary furniture of library.

#### III. Maintenance of equipments and machineries.

The following amount of funds may be allocated to the different departments to carry out the maintenance of equipment and machineries.

#### IV. Approval for procurement of raw materials.

It is proposed to procure raw materials for conduct of practical classes and examination of laboratories for which amount of Rs 1 lakh is approved from Development Fund.

#### V. Display Boards for Role Models:-

Display Boards indicating the details of distinguished alumni of the Institution are to be procured for motivational inspiration of students for which Rs. 2 lakh is approved from Development fund.

#### VI. Project Work and study visits:-

An amount of **Rs. 2.5 Lakh** is spent from PL Development Fund for different Projects and study visit of the students

#### VII. Beautification & Sanitation of the institute.-

As a part of Swachhata Mission, emphasis is given for Beautification, Cleanliness and Sanitation of the institution and its surrounding. Hence an amount of Rs.1.5 Lakh is hereby approved from the IRG fund for maintaining cleanliness and beautification of the Institution premises.

#### VIII. Set up of IOT Lab and Incubation Centre:-

New IOT Lab and Incubation centre is to be set up in the institution. For this an amount of Rs 5 lakh for IOT Lab and 5 lakh for Incubation centre are hereby approved from IRG head.

#### IX. Procurement of Interactive panels:-

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An amount of Rs 5 Lakhs is approved from Development head for procurement of interactive panels to be installed in classrooms.

#### X. Procurement of Furniture for MatLab:-

An amount of Rs 1 Lakh is approved from Development head for procurement of furniture for Mat-lab.

#### XI. Installation and Electrical Connection to the newly procured Machineries:-

Some new machines are procured from the sanctioned DTET fund, which are to be installed in the laboratories and electrical connections are to be made, for which an amount of Rs. 3 lakhs is hereby approved from Development Fund.

#### XII. Electrical Maintenance:-

Periodic Electrical maintenance is required for repairing/ replacement of existing defective electrical wiring/ components to avoid any electrical hazards for which Rs. 3 lakhs is hereby approved from Development Fund.

#### XIII. Procurement of Water purifier- cum- Cooler:-

Three Water purifier- cum- Cooler of 2 tap system may be procured for installation in the Hostels, for which an amount of Rs. 3 lakhs is hereby approved from institute PL development / Hostel Contingency fund on priority basis.

#### XIV. Procurement of Antivirus for Desktop Computers:-

For protection & safety of computers, antivirus are required for which an amount of Rs 2 lakhs is hereby approved from institute PL development fund.

#### XV. Annual maintenance of Appliances-

Regular maintenance is required for the Water Purifiers, Air conditioners, CCTV, BIOMETRIC MACHINES and the DG set for effective performance. Hence Annual Maintenance of the above are to be met from IRG Fund as per the charges.

#### XV. Cafeteria Furniture:-

An amount of Rs 1 lakh is hereby approved from IRG Fund for procurement of furniture for Cafeteria.

# XVI. Procurement of On line UPS for ETC department & Replacement of Battery of Exam section:-

An amount of Rs 3.30 lakhs for Online UPS of ETC Dept and 1.7 lakhs for replacement of old battery of Evaluation section is hereby approved.

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# XVII. Furnishing of the Lobby Area:

An amount of Rs. 5 lakh is hereby approved for the furnishing of the Lobby Area from available IRG fund.

# 6. REVIEW OF CIVIL/EI/ PH WORK OF THE INSTITUTE:

The committee reviewed the construction of following works executed by R&B Division, Jharsuguda .

- i) The construction of boundary wall is in progress (State fund. Rs 88.38 Lakhs).
- ii) Construction of gallery is in progress (OMBADC fund, Rs 98.92 Lakhs)
- iii) Tender process for construction of staff quarter under OMBADC is over whereas agreement is still pending(Rs 446.55 Lakhs). The Chairman advised R&B Division, Jharsuguda to expedite the process on urgent basis.
- iv) Roof top tarfelting of Main Academic building is over under OMBADC fund (Rs 10.40 Lakhs) .
- v) Main gate, Cow catcher and Security room construction completed under OMBADC fund (Rs 17.95 Lakhs).
- v) Repair and renovation of kitchen of Boys Hostel II, tile flooring and renovation of different rooms and laboratories, raising of boundary wall works have been completed through allotted state fund (Rs. 80 Lakhs)
- vi) One flat type quarter will be constructed for ITI and JES,JSG by demolishing old quarter. The declaration of strength unsafe of quarter for demolition is pending with R&B.The Chairman advised R&B Division to complete the process by 10<sup>th</sup> March 2023.
- vii) One flat type quarter will be constructed for Principal and Vice-Principal, JES,JSG by demolishing old quarter. The declaration of strength unsafe of quarter for demolition is pending with R&B.The Chairman advised R&B Division to complete the process by 10<sup>th</sup> March 2023.
- viii) 03 nos of borewell with tubewell is approved from CSIR head of Vedanta Ltd, Jharsuguda for hostels due to scarcity of water in Summer season by end of March 2023.
- ix) Cladding of main academic building is approved .The funds will be met out from the state fund after submission of estimates.

#### 8. MOU WITH INDUSTRIES:

As per AICTE guidelines it is mandatory for the Institution to have MOU with industries under Industry Institute Interaction program under which Industries are to extend their cooperation in Internship, Placement, Extension Lectures, Industry visits, Training by Industry personnel and curriculum development to prepare the students fit for industries. Currently the institution is having MOUs with 05 nos of organizations i.e. Vedanta limited, Protionix Global Foundation, Steelage Industries, Suderson engineering works, Jhadeswar ispat Private Limited. Other local Industries may be requested to sign the MOU as a part of Industry Institute Partnership. It is also requested to the industry people to conduct short term training for the students in our institute premises. This is approved.

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#### 9. PLACEMENT OF FUNDS UNDER DMF:

The following proposal were placed before the committee.

- i) Mandatory Fire Safety provision like Ramp Construction, Separate Entry & Exit for any building, Roof Connection between New Academic Block and The ETC Building. The proposal is approved.
- ii) Construction of additional staircase wherever required for fire safety measure. The proposal is approved.
- iii) Barrier free toilet and provision of ramp in each building is to be constructed for specially abled students as per AICTE norms. The work will be taken up by Executive Engineer, PHD, Jharsuguda.
- iv) Provision of 60 seated bus for the institution study visit of students. The proposal is approved to be funded from DMF.
- v) S/R to Jharsuguda Engineering School, Jharsuguda(such as Fitting and Fixing of UPVC Door and Window at-Administrative Building, Electronics & Academic Building) for the year of 2022-23. (Rs 44.37 Lakhs). The proposal is approved and to be funded by state fund.
- vi) S/R to Jharsuguda Engineering School, Jharsuguda (such as fitting and fixing of Tiles, Tarfelting, Grading at-Administrative Building and Electronics Building) for the year of 2022-23. (Rs 43.56 Lakhs). The proposal is approved and to be funded by state fund.
- vii) Development of sports infrastructure to Jharsuguda Engineering School, Jharsuguda (such as leveling the Play Ground, Construction of Drain, Basket Ball Court, Badminton Court, Volley Ball Court and Tennis Court) for the year of 2022-23. (Rs 58.08 Lakhs). The proposal is approved to be funded from DMF.
- viii) Gallery construction is in progress, so additional fund may be placed from DMF for Green room, stage with shed, turfing of ground, highmast light for betterment of students' sports facility. The proposal is approved and will be funded by DMF after submission of estimates.

#### 10. ESTABLISHMENT OF A INDUSTRY SPONSORED LAB

During ranking of polytechnics utmost importance is given for the collaboration of industry with the institute. Under this a proposal has been given vide letter no 2809/Jes dtd 02/11/22 to Vedanta limited for setting up of Brick Manufacturing Laboratory from waste plastics, flyash of the industry and locally available material at Civil Engineering department. It is again requested for setting up of the Lab for the research and innovation work. The Chairman welcomed this proposal and instructed M/s Vedanta Ltd to take up the proposal for early implementation after due scrutiny of DPR. Similarly, the Chairman advised to set up a lab for production of Aluminium Profiles by using Aluminium Extrusions from M/s Vedanta Ltd, Jharsuguda after

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submission of DPR. M/s Protionix Global foundation presented a proposal for establishment of incubation centre in the campus under CSR fund of Airport Authority of India. The Chairman advised to submit the detailed proposal to be forwarded to Airport Authority.

#### 11. MISCLLANEOUS POINTS

> Approval for payment of electric bills, Internet Bill, Remuneration of PTGF & PTGLA & remuneration of outsourcing personnel, maintenance of Electrical & P.H. works etc:-

It is proposed that in case of insufficient Govt. allotment, approval may be accorded for payment of electric bills, Internet Bill, Remuneration of PTGF & PTGLA & remuneration of outsourcing personnel, maintenance of Electrical & P.H. works may be made out of the Institute Development/IRG head. This is approved.

- ➤ A number of guest faculties, guest instructors and apprenticeship trainees are requesting to provide accommodation. They are allowed to reside in the dormitory of Guest House with rent of 150/- per month subjected to vacancy Guest House and quarter(as per Govt. Rules). A separate rate chart is placed in the Annexure III is approved for residing in the Guest House.
  - ➤ As construction of Boundary wall is in progress, encroachment of land by outsiders to be vacated (some of them have been resolved at Institute level). Hence Tahasildar, Jharsuguda /Sub Collector ,Jharsuguda is instructed for these purposes.
  - ➤ Vacation of Government quarters from outsiders. Many of the quarters have been vacated and for remaining quarters steps is to be initiated for vacation. The Chairman suggested to serve notice in presence of two witnesses to the outsiders. After the notice period, requisition of police personnel and Magistrate will be made for vacation of quarters.
  - > Occupation of Institution Guest House as Saraswati Shishu Mandir . Steps initiated for vacation which may require intervention of District Administration. The steps will be taken by administration.
  - ➤ ENGAGEMENT OF OUTSOURCING PERSONNEL:-As per the approval received from DTET only 14 nos. of outsourcing persons are engaged in the institution and hostels .However it is very difficult to manage the institution and 6 Hostels with only 14 nos. of outsourcing persons. Engagement of following persons may be approved who are to be engaged on outsourcing basis from the development fund.

Driver: 01 no

Watchman: 03 nos

Mali:01 no

Sweeper: 03 nos

Further in case of emergency persons may be engaged on daily wage basis and the expenditure may be met from Development Fund/ IRG Fund/ Hostel Contingency. This is approved.

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- Rate enhancement for various items of work under IRG:-As per Letter No. SDTE-PDE-II-Poly-0003-2023-657/SDTE, Bhubaneswar, dtd 24.01.2023 a revised rate for various items of work under IRG is prepared and placed in Annexure II. The rate is approved.
- > CAFETERIA MANAGEMENT:-As day boarders are facing problem for their fooding it is proposed to make the cafeteria functional and the mess supervisor of ladies hostel will be given the responsibility of running it. This is approved.
- ▶ Lifting of felled tree logs from the campus of JES, Jharsuguda:- Some of the old tree logs are present inside the campus. These tree logs were either felled naturally or for cut for some development purpose. Now it is creating nuisance and causing hindrance in development work as well as environmental aesthetics of the Institute. The Chairman informed The Divisional Forest Officer/Divisional Manager, Odisha Forest Development Corporation LTD., Jharsuguda to take necessary steps for lifting of the felled tree logs from the campus.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the chair.

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
